## Brig. Gen. Clint A. Barnes

## Commanding General, 103rd Sustainment Command (Expeditionary)

Brigadier General Clint A. Barnes received an ROTC commission from Marion Military Institute, Marion, AL. He holds a Bachelor of Science in Communications from Trevecca Nazerene University in Nashville, TN; a Master of Business Administration from Keller Graduate School in Atlanta, GA; and a Master of Science in National Security and Strategic Studies from National War College at National Defense University in Washington, D.C.

Brig. Gen. Barnes has served in the Army National Guard (ARNG) in three states; Alabama,



Tennessee and Georgia. BG Barnes joined the Army Reserve in May 2001. Upon his assignment to the Army Reserve, he served as the S1 and Adjutant, 2125th Garrison Support Unit (USAR on Active Duty) at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. He also served as Commander, Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 2125th Garrison Support Unit at Fort Bragg, NC.

In October 2004, he transferred to Headquarters, First U.S. Army at Fort Gillem, Georgia where he served as Medical Holdover Team Chief. In July 2006, he became the Executive Officer and Aide-de-Camp to the Deputy Commanding General, First U.S. Army. From January 2008 to January 2010, Brig. Gen. Barnes was assigned to U.S. Army Reserve Command at Fort McPherson, Georgia where he was the Unit Mobilization Officer.
